## The Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012

In accordance with the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012 (the Regulations) please find attached formal notice, issued to you in your capacity as chairman of the Council's Strategic Overview and Scrutiny Committee.

You will see from the attached notice that the Council's Executive wish to consider an urgent exempt item at its meeting on 18<sup>th</sup> January 2018, which has not be the subject of the 28 days notice required under the regulations.

Having considered the matter as Proper Officer I am satisfied that it would be impractical to comply with the regulations and that it would be appropriate to rely on the exemption to publication provided in regulation 10.

A copy of the attached notice, together with a notice setting out the reasons why compliance with the regulations was impracticable will be published on the Council's website.

## Notice under Regulation 10 of the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012

- 1. At least 28 clear days before a private meeting<sup>1</sup>, the decision-making body must make available at its offices a notice of the intention to hold the meeting in private, and must also publish that notice on their website (if they have one)<sup>2</sup>.
- 2. The notice referred to in paragraph 1 above must also include a statement of the reasons for the meeting to be held in private<sup>3</sup>.
- 3. At least 28 clear days before making a key decision<sup>4</sup>, the decision-making body must make available at its offices a notice of the intention to make that decision, and must also publish that notice on their website (if they have one)<sup>5</sup>
- 4. The notice referred to in paragraph 3 above must include a statement of the reasons for the meeting to be held in private, details of any representations received about why the meeting should be open to the public, and a statement of its response to any such questions.
- 5. Where the date by which a meeting must be held makes compliance with the above requirements impractical, the meeting may only be held in private and a key decision taken where the decision-making body has obtained agreement from the chairman of the relevant overview and scrutiny committee that the meeting is urgent and cannot reasonably be deferred<sup>6</sup>.
