

Snigs End A Chartist Settlement

To the east, the landform continues in the same vein as the south, rising only 5m between School Crescent and the B4211, with an open character and little tree coverage. Beyond the B4211 the land rises steeply towards a wooded expanse at Corse Wood Hill reaching 85m AOD at its highest point.

The boundary is defined to the north west where the land drops away sharply to Glynch Brook. Heading northwards, the boundary is further enclosed by the wooded expanse of Staunton Coppice.

To the north east, the boundary is defined by Malvern Road flowing into Straight Lane. Intervening 2/3 storey development as well as unmanaged hedgerows, between the road way and the Chartist settlement obscure all views.

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The boundary extends to approximately 1km beyond the settlement as the topography is very flat, remaining at 25m AOD. The landscape is open in character with an extensive field network defined by hedgerows, with few mature trees. Beyond Oridge Street the landform rises gently however the settlement is obscured by intervening development and vegetation.

To the west the landform rises gently from the settlement to a ridge at 35m in line with Mill Lane, near Brierley Grange from which the settlement can be viewed beyond Staunton Court.
